

Out of these 115 projects and project ideas, 45 have been approved to receive around 78 million euro of mostly EU funding. Hackathons like today have played a crucial role in achieving these numbers. And that is why we are here for its third edition and hope that in 2026 there will be a fourth.

SETTING THE STAGE



Today we come to the cherry on the cake by bringing the stakeholders together from both sides of the Mediterranean working on the practical side of the policy - the projects is what we count at the end. WestMED has been a successful example of cooperation and we advertise it: at the UfM stakeholder conference in Athens, The Ocean days and the European Maritime Day. The Mediterranean is gaining importance at the European Commission with a dedicated Commisioner for the Mediterranean and a new commisioner for for the Fisheries and the oceans. So we will be working on new strategies on how to get the best out of the ocean and the environment.

Then we will start with the core of our hackathon which we call project development labs. These are very practical sessions to identify 2-3 project ideas per lab that we will further develop in the following months.

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES





All five thematics today are very important to us at Interreg NEXT MED. We co-finance 89% of the projects. To be eligible, it is absolutely key to have partners from both shores of the Mediterranean - you need a partner from the Northern shore and a partner from the Southern shore. You also need at least three countries, usually there are more, to have a Mediterranean (wide) impact with your proposed solution to a Mediterranean wide problem.

BlueInvest is a EU funded initiative which aims to boost innovation in the sustainable blue economy. It is a platform that analyses the blue economy from the perspective of the investor. I recommend you all to read the BlueInvest report with very important insights. There is also the network of blue coaches for SMEs and startups to help refine their business models, and there is a pipeline of projects from early stage to mature-having the seal of BlueInvest. It makes these projects more monetizable.

will give you an insight into a new EMFAF call with a deadline of 18 February 2024. It is a 5.7 million call for proposals with two different topics: the first topic seeks to fund highly innovative regional flagships projects supporting sustainable blue economy in EU sea basins for Smart Specialisation. The second topic is related to demonstrating the feasibility and environmental benefits of regenerative ocean farming and boosting algae innovation. Non-EU countries involved in the WestMED are also eligible.

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES











Erasmus+ is the EU program for education, training, youth and sports. It intends to promote and facilitate the circulation of ideas, best practices and knowledge between European citizens and in some specific actions between Europe and some other continents. It is for instance meant to develop new curricula, create new professional profiles and training skills to young people or training for researchers in general. PROJECT PITCHES



CALLMEBLUE stands for Cluster Alliance in the Mediterranean Sea Basin and the main scope is to strengthen maritime alliances for north-south cooperation to create transferable models of interregional dialogue and collaboration between clusters at sea basin level. We have a large partnership with clusters from Italy, Spain, Portugal, Tunisia, an incubator from Algeria and an investment network at Mediterranean level. Next to improved dialogue, one of the objectives is also to promote empowerment of the embryonic & emerging maritime clusters ecosystem.





Lidia Rossi | CALLMEBLUE (ForMARE)





The core of our project EU WeMED_NaTour is the future generation - our children are super digitally connected but also addicted. In particular when they are on holidays, they can't enjoy what they have around them. We developed innovative eco-smart tourism packages for school trip tourism that we piloted in four different countries in four different schools; in Spain, Italy, Mauritaninia and Portugal. And we try to empower tourism SMEs in green and blue skills with an online free training programme.

The goal of WINBIG is to map the current status of gender imbalace, identify capacity gaps and empower women in the blue economy across all the six European sea basins with a focus on three emerging sectors: blue bioeconomy, blue sports & sustainable tourism, marine renewable energies & robotics. We launched a survey with already 800 respondents, did a peer review publication covering 650 reports, identified 75 women champions for testimonials and created a database of more than 700 mentors to help women in entrepreneurship, leadership and innovation. You can help increase these numbers as we still need many more respondents, women champions and mentors.

PROJECT PITCHES



GreenMarineMed is a Mediterranean shipping project with three core themes: create a strong and lasting network of key players in Mediterranean green shipping ecosystem, deliver a clear assessment of where are we now when it comes to Green shipping Technologies and to foster Innovation and facilitate access to finance. For this last point we will be launching a call for innovation open to entrepreneurs from Mediterranean countries. We also launched the center of excellence to build this core network of different actors uniting them across the Mediteranean, to catalyze Innovation drive collaborative solutions and attract strategic investments

BlueAquaEdu is a 3 year educational program aimed at enhancing engagement and learning amongst teenagers and students with a focus on aquaculture, the post-harvesting value chain and valorisation of byproducts. The plan of the project is to develop a gamefication app, a virtual aquaculture Educational network, an E-platform with experienced mentors and events like workshops, summer schools and apprenticships. In 2021 we started analysing what was missing and realised that our ocean was missing. From there we started to build this BlueSkills' Initiative. It now consists of an advanced Master course and a Summer school dealing with all aspects of the Blue Economy. In 2023 we were ranked first as top master with enrollments from 20 countries. We build bridges between the acadamia, the government and the industry in order to fill the job gaps.

AQUACULTURE PROJECT DEVELOPMENT LAB



Context

The Aquaculture project development lab consisted of 11 stakeholders representing academia, NGOs, public authorities and the private sector.

It was organised in collaboration with the <u>Aquaculture Assistance</u> <u>Mechanism</u> that presented recent publications, trainings and other relevant case studies.

Participants shared their experiences regarding their involvement in other projects. Four specific project ideas were presented and discussed in light of the open Aquaculture EMFAF call and the upcoming Interreg NEXT MED call - participants expressed their interest in becoming part of a partnership that could be further supported by WestMED's Technical Group AquaWest to further elaborate on this.

Outcomes and emerged ideas

- MSP/AZAs could provide opportunities to remove barriers on licensing farms and access to space by using pilot test sites
- Multiuse approach in MPAs that could assess and test ecofriendly aquaculture
- Explore the development of sustainable feed based in local sources

GREEN SHIPPING & PORTS

PROJECT DEVELOPMENT LAB



Context

This lab was attended by approx. 20 participants including colleagues from beyond the WestMED region like Türkiye, Greece and Bosnia Herzegovina. After the Union for the Mediterranean (UfM) presented an <u>update on progress towards the implementation of the UfM Regional Action Plan on Transport 2021-2027</u>, Interreg NEXT MED shared an update on the status of the 2nd green economy call. Before opening the floor and starting the exchange, the WestMED National Hub for Italy concluded the introduction by presenting the progress made under the WestMED Initiative and its <u>Technical Group on Green Shipping</u> with among others, a recently submitted proposal for a new S3 partnership with 30 partners from EU and non EU countries.

Outcomes and emerged ideas (first 3 most innovative)

- Scaling up of innovative approaches to bunkering, ship repair, etc as piloted by the Canary Islands
- Network of Excellence Centers
- · Upgrade of energy grids to serve smaller ports
- Digital twin focusing on common ports & oceans -contributing to a unified approach to data collection and management
- Transitional fuels linking to the green hydrogen supply chain and the concept of energy communities

MARITIME CLUSTERS

PROJECT DEVELOPMENT LAB



Context

The <u>WestMED Cluster Alliance</u> is a successful initiative supported by the WestMED Assistance Mechanism and led by Mediterranean Maritime Clusters from the two shores of the region. So far, this Alliance has already fostered valuable project ideas and partnership to scale-up emerging clusters (notably on the southern shore), as well as experimenting acceleration of innovative solutions through cascade funding (mainy for the northern shore).

This hackathon was the occasion to investigate future developments for the WestMED Cluster Allliance, also involving clusters from the Eastern Mediterranean (WestMED Alliance+) and further foster the pivotal role for maritime clusters on promoting a sustainable, green and innovative blue eocnomy.

Outcomes and emerged ideas

- Clusters cooperation to foster uptake of digitalisation and data services across local value chains
- Cluster as a facilitator to incubate and accelerate/ scale-up local innovative solutions
- Possibly the two projects being merged into one, by building upon previous projects from the WestMED+ Cluster Alliance

Potential funding opportunities targeted

- INTERREG NEXT MED (preferred)
- ERASMUS+ Innovation Alliances (not discussed)



BLUE SKILLS & CAREERS

PROJECT DEVELOPMENT LAB



Context

After an introduction on the state of play of the Blue Skills developments across EU sectors and some of the latest EU calls, this lab consisting of approx. 15 stakeholders, exchanged thoughts related to 4 specfic topics: (1) Upskill and reskill of the workforce to meet the demands of new jobs and technologies, (2) Facilitate the process of mutual recognition of qualifications, (3) Increase the cross-border mobility of workers in blue economy sectors and (4) Ensure the promotion of maritime professions.

Outcomes and emerged ideas

- Creation of a WestMED label for education and training certification via a MoU between WestMED initiative and education or training operators/ Setting a network of labelled education or training operators in WestMED+ (consistency with UfM)
- Baseline study on BE skills (definition and needs) in the WestMED+, building on the outcomes of the ongoing study at EC level with a seabasin focus (to be considered in cooperation with UfM)
- Capacity building for public servants on Maritime affairs and policies enforcement/ regulation via EU agencies (e.g EFCA, EMSA, Frontex)
 virtual maritime policy academy building on EFCA experiences (FIUUFRA e-FishMed)

- UfM/EMFAF direct management
- EMFAF or TAEIX



TOURISMPROJECT DEVELOPMENT LAB



Context

As stated in the WestMED Malta Ministerial Declaration (2023), the main objective was to 'strengthen the competitiveness and sustainability of the coastal and maritime tourism sector,' as part of a smart and resilient blue economy – one of the key goals of the WestMED Initiative. This, by preserving the marine and coastal environment as well as marine cultural heritage and contributing to the attractiveness of coastal areas by means of ecotourism, digitalization and mobilizing private-public investments.

Outcomes and emerged ideas (most voted)

- Capitalizing the results of EU WEMED NA_TOUR project and pursuing its expansion to other geographical contexts and target groups.
- Development a SMART Sustainability Platform. This platform will pursue the democratization of the information and seek to advance on indicators and ways to measure the impact that the use of technologies could have on creating behavior changes, new tourism demands and the development of new sustainable business activities
