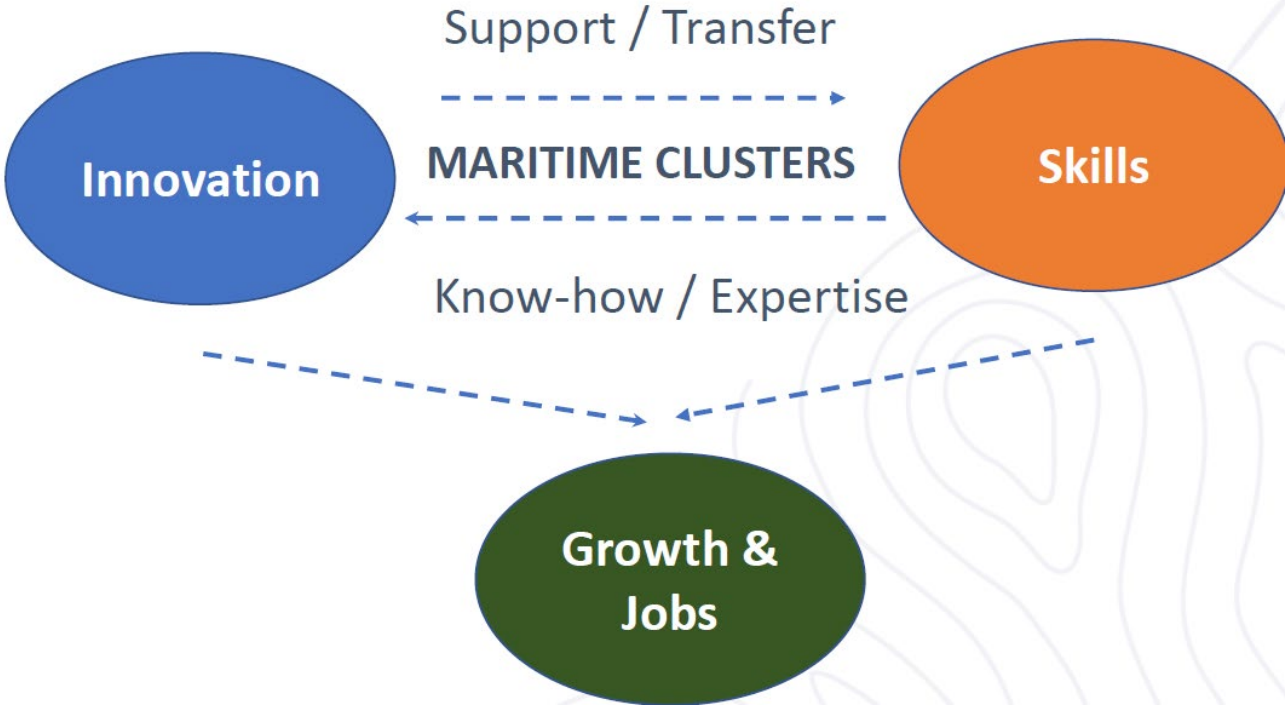
Context (I)

- Maritime clusters play an essential role as brokers between EU regions and neighbouring countries in the Mediterranean.
- They are essential actors in aggregating local SMEs and large companies across a range of sectors in the blue economy, including through synergies with enterprises involved in in-land activities across complex value chains.
- The western Mediterranean has a wide number of maritime clusters active in coastal areas, with strong emerging practices across the southern shore.
- A clear opportunity exists for the WestMED Initiative to support a stronger alliance across the most active Maritime Clusters in the western Mediterranean, and beyond.



Context (II)

Clusters: innovation and skills for sustainable growth and jobs



Maritime Clusters
in the Mediterranean

Aim

The key objectives of the Alliance are:

- **More uniform and inclusive Mediterranean ecosystem, which implies opportunities for all operators, who join their clusters;**
- **Cluster dialogue:** Support exchange of knowledge and practices across maritime and non-maritime clusters
- **South-South cooperation:** Boost the development of southern maritime clusters
- **North-South capacity building:** Upgrade cluster management skills
- **Encourage clustering in dedicated – potentially ideal – contexts:** port areas, MPAs, R&I parks
- **Provide a platform for the matching of operators and exploitation of synergies,** including incubation&acceleration opportunities, public and/or private investments, industrial and/or commercial partnerships, participation in R&D programmes and innovation hubs, internationalization, update & upgrade of skills, etc.

Structure

Launched on the 1st of June 2021, with **8 national clusters in the western Mediterranean**, the Cluster Alliance is promoted and led by the involved clusters and supported by the WestMED Assistance Mechanism - the respective WestMED National Hubs with a prominent role for the **Italian National Hub and the Cluster Maritime Tunisien**.

- Spain - Cluster Maritimo Espanol;
- Tunisia - CMT, ClusterMaritimeTunisien(leading on 'north-south cooperation').

The WestMED Maritime Clusters Alliance progressively enlarged to other national, local and sectoral clusters: Algeria's Leancubator, Greece's Strategis Cluster, Italy's DLTM, FVGMARE, COSVAP; Libyan Maritime Cluster, Mauritanian Maritime and Marine Cluster, Spain's CMMA.

In September 2025, the WestMED Maritime Clusters Alliance has acquired the status of Observer within the ENMC.

Key activities (I)

Support projects' ideas development, establishment of consortia and search of funding opportunities

3rd edition WestMED Hackathon, October 2024.

This hackathon was the occasion to investigate future developments for the WestMED Cluster Alliance, also involving clusters from the Eastern Mediterranean (WestMED Alliance+) and further foster the pivotal role for maritime clusters on promoting a sustainable, green and innovative blue economy.

Outcomes and emerged ideas:

- Clusters cooperation to foster uptake of digitalisation and data services across local value chains
- Cluster as a facilitator to incubate and accelerate/ scale-up local innovative solutions
- Possibly the two projects being merged into one, by building upon previous projects from the WestMED+ Cluster Alliance



Key activities (II)

Support projects' ideas development and collaboration with funded projects

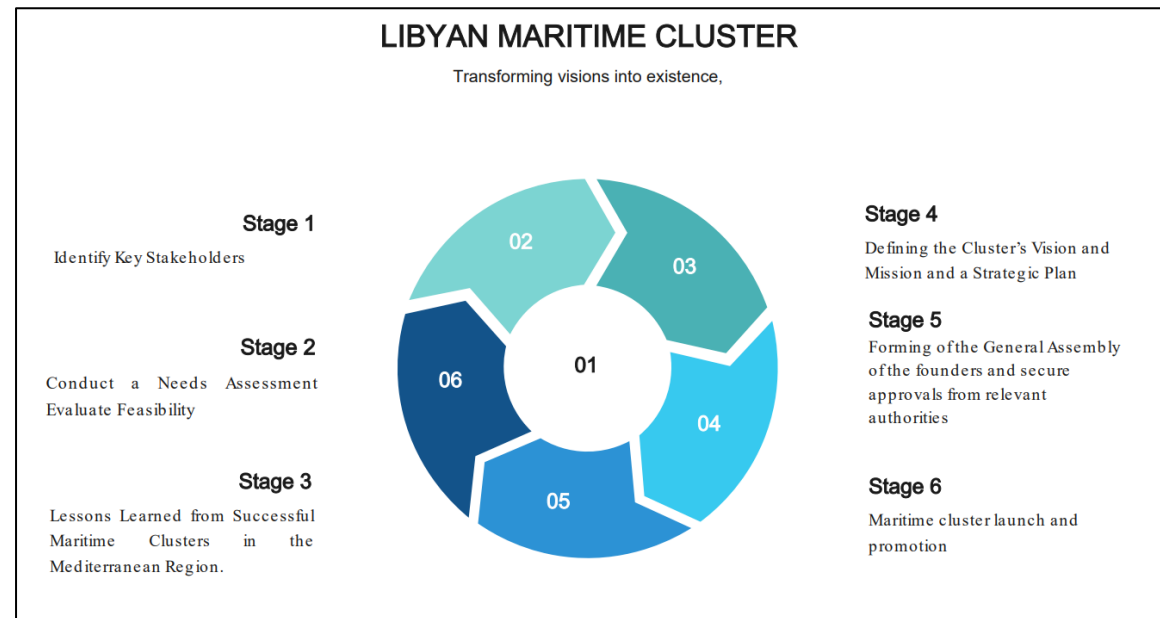
- The Maritime Cluster Alliance has supported several proposals that have received funds. For example: ERASMUS+ – MARMED and MAQUAM, COSME Euroclusters – MedBan, IKAT and ELBE Alliance, EMFAF Women in Blue Economy – WINBIG, EMFAF Maritime Clusters CALLMEBLUE and Green Marine MED, EMFAF Ports & Maritime Transport POWER4MED.
- Collaboration with funded projects. For example, on 14 October 2024, WestMED's National Hub Tunisia participated in a workshop organised by the Cluster Maritime Tunisian, titled 'Maritime clusters, catalysts for the development of the blue economy'. This workshop was part of the European CallMeBlue project, which aims to strengthen synergies between maritime clusters in the North and South and to promote regional maritime dynamics.



Key activities (III)

Support to the creation of new Maritime Clusters within the WestMED seabasin

- Support to the creation of the Mauritanian Maritime Cluster (June, 2022)
- Support to the creation of the Libyan Maritime Cluster (September 2024)



Key activities (IV)

Strengthen collaboration and synergies among maritime clusters

- The WestMED Initiative facilitates cluster cooperation in the maritime sectors and will continue to support this through the WestMED Maritime Clusters Alliance. A clear opportunity exists for the WestMED Initiative to further help build stronger alliances between the most active Maritime Clusters in the western Mediterranean, and beyond.
- In June 2020, the Cluster Maritime Tunisie signed an MoU with the Italian national clusters, aiming at a closer cooperation, including the research activities. The MoU was renewed in 2025.
- On June 9th 2023 in Rome, the president of the Mauritanian Marine and Maritime Cluster signed an MoU with the Italian national clusters, aiming at a closer cooperation, including the research activities.



Key activities (V)

Strengthen collaboration and synergies among maritime clusters

- In February 2024, a new strategic agreement between Greek and Tunisian maritime clusters represents an official gateway to boost the blue economy between the western and eastern Mediterranean. The MoU is based on the principles of cooperation by strengthening and expanding networking opportunities between both clusters as well as collaborating in initiatives and alliances on innovation and internalisation of blue economy in a broader sense. The exchange of information, knowledge and collaborative innovation ideas, is another key pillar of this joint initiative.



Key activities (VI)

Strengthen collaboration and synergies among maritime clusters

- In October 2024, an agreement was signed between the Algerian incubator 'Leancubator' and the Tunisian Maritime Cluster. The agreement provides for 'the creation of opportunities for Algerian players in the blue economy, through international cooperation, the exchange of expertise between the two countries and support for innovation between them, with joint projects to be launched in the coming months.
- In July 2025, an MoU was signed among the Libyan Maritime Cluster and the Italian national clusters (CTN BIG and FdM), aiming at a closer cooperation, to boost partnerships and investments.



A new roadmap for 2026-2027 activities

The 2026-2027 activities will be focused on “equipping” the whole MCA with those operative tools developed within the supported EU funded projects and/or implemented by each cluster at national/local/sectoral level.


Such a move will:

- -provide the instruments to increase support by the clusters towards their associates, also allowing them to access to an international community and the related opportunities;
- -increase MCA’s role of counterpart towards investors, accelerators&incubators, innovation hubs, multilateral institutions;
- -foster the exchanges of human resources among the WM MCA Clusters, consolidating the team-building and the optimization of the service capacities.

As a consequence a detailed calendar of WM MCA events will be drafted, in order to provide the suitable training on the common operative tools, to exploit the relevant commercial configuration(s), to exploit the synergies with the other cluster platforms.

The new roadmap will exploit the described actions, considering the renewed maritime policies tackled by the European Ocean Pact, the Pact for the Mediterranean, the Union for the Mediterranean and the established synergies with regional multilateral institutions (the African Union, the Arabic Maghreb Union, etc.).
